In April 2007, the college was accredited B+ and in 2010, it was awarded College with Potential for Excellence. In 2015, this college has been accredited 'A' grade by NAAC. 

National Seminar & Conferences, Workshop/Symposium/Guest Lectures

A National seminar on the topic "Relevance of Pandit Deendayal thoughts in the development of Youth in the present era" was conducted by Department of Economics on 05th and 06th of February 2020. Total 161 delegates participated in this National seminar. Two books were also released in the inaugural session "Shodh Evam Shikshan: Gandhivadi Drishtikon" by Mamta Singh and "Monetary Economics" by Dr Kriti Sharma, DJ college, Baraut. The resource persons focused on thoughts of Pandit Deen Dayal Upadhyay on youth building, rise of the last man, national integration, etc.

A one day workshop was organized by the Department of **Physics** on the topic semiconductor devices on 29th of January 2020. The objective of the program was to update knowledge and understanding of Physics and dwelve into the intricate concepts within the subject. The key note speaker told the students about semiconductor devices and making of transistors and diodes. Other resource persons told about the origin of the zener diode, rectifier and configuration of semiconductor, conductor, superconductor, the flow of current, and basics of electronics. Total 94 students participated in this workshop.







A three day yoga workshop was organized by B.Ed. Department on the topic "Importance of Yoga in our Daily Life" from 11th of September to 13th of September 2019. The resource person taught a few asans as Surya namaskar, Bhujanga asan, Tadasan, Vakrasan, etc to the students and about the importance of yoga. A total of 75 students participated in this workshop.



A five day workshop on the topic "English enhancement language and preparatory Program" was organized by the Department of B.Ed from 11th of December to 16th of December 2019 . The objective of this workshop was to develop ability of the students to use English in day-to-day life and developed the knowledge and understanding of English in meaningful manner. The keynote speaker told the students the correct methods of using various topics of grammar related to competitive English examinations. Total 98 students participated in this workshop.



A two day workshop on the topic "How to get good score in TET examination" was organized by B.Ed Department from 17th of December to 18th of December 2019. Total 24 students participated in this workshop. The objective of this workshop was to promote good scores of students in competitive examination and to enhance their learning ability.



A Symposium on "The relevance of Hindi language" was organized by the Department of Hindi on 14th of September 2019 to celebrate Hindi Diwas. The objective of this program was to educate the students about the reasons for celebrating Hindi Diwas and its objective. They were also about told the relevance of the Hindi language in the present era. Total 16 students participated in this symposium.


MAJOR FACULTY ACHIEVEMENTS


