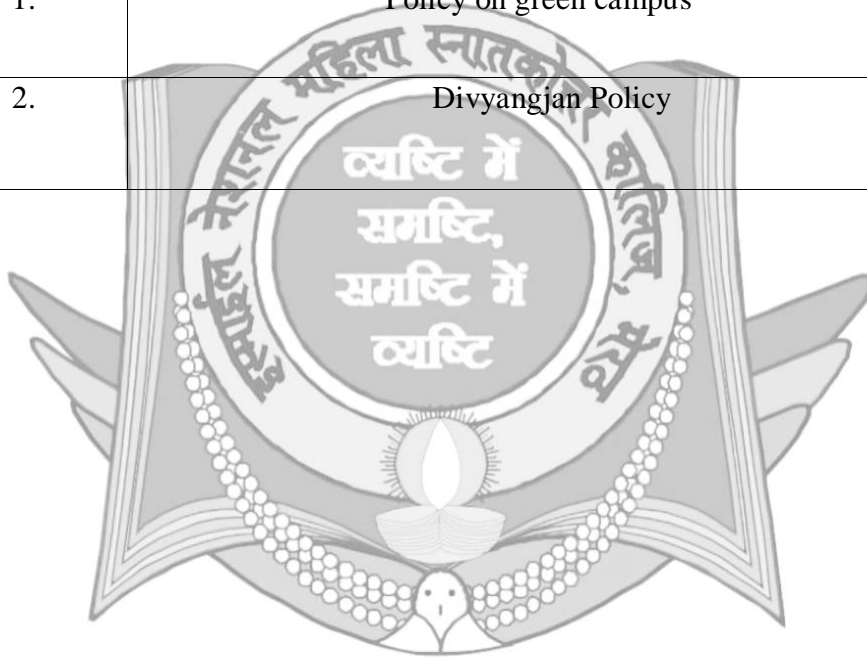

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Policy on Green Campus

Our college's environment management system aims to create awareness amongst teachers, staff, students, and management. Being conscious of our fundamental duties, we try to maintain a pollution free campus and incorporate best practices to help create a better environment for future generations. The college is committed wholeheartedly to the cause of the environment. It commits to promoting, monitoring, and operating environmental activities with the slogan 'Clean & Green Smile'. We take all positive initiatives to make our college an environment-friendly place, which will serve as a model for other colleges.

OBJECTIVES:

- To teach students about the importance of the environment and its issues.
- To create an eco-friendly campus by completely eliminating the plastic waste on the campus premises.
- Reducing waste sent to landfills, reducing the environmental and other effects of transport, and reducing pollution.
- To integrate environmental concerns into policies, plans, and programs for social development and outreach activities.
- To conserve energy by promoting all alternative energy resources, such as solar energy and other power efficient equipment.
- To encourage and inculcate clean and green practices among students, such as water management and conservation practices.

SPECIFIC MEASURES THAT COLLEGE CAN IMPLEMENT

No Fuel Day in the College:

The college takes the initiative to prevent air pollution. All the staff members and students will be guided to avoid using vehicles at least once a week. It will keep the campus vehicle free, thereby saving on fuel and reducing environmental pollution. The college also encourages the use of bicycles or battery-powered vehicles.



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Paper Reuse:

With regular classes, teachers will be guided to inculcate environment friendly values among students, such as making paper bags with used paper and waste newspapers.

Tree Plantation:

In collaboration with other active committees and departments, the college organizes regular tree plantations and poster competitions on environmental themes to raise awareness about nature and natural resources. The college also prefers providing mini plants to the guests as a present to extend the environmental issue outside the college.

Clean and green workshops, seminars, and programs:

The college organizes various awareness events and programs that stress the issues of the environment and sustainability. The details of some awareness programs are as follows:

- Exhibition of handmade items (designer jewelry and handbags, tote bags) made by college students using waste papers and old newspapers.
- Rainwater harvesting in college premises.
- Organizing poster, debate, and quiz competitions by various committees (Rangers Committee, N.S.S, Road Safety Club) and departments

Water Recharge:

To implement 'Rain Water Harvesting' on campus, we collected rainwater from the college roof and allowed it to percolate into the system, assisting groundwater recharge.

Waste Management:

Students and staff are educated on proper waste management practices through lectures and displaying slogan boards on campus. There is separate management for dry and wet waste, as colour coded dustbins are used for different wastes. Green for wet waste and blue for solid waste.

Waste management has been initiated by going digital and reducing paper use. The focus has been laid on reusing and recycling the used papers in the library and various other offices in the college. The college has banned the burning of dry leaves and branches.



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Energy Conservation:

The college has been very mindful about energy conservation. All fans, tube lights, switches, and fans are numbered so that only the needed ones will be switched on. On every floor, staff and students are trained to switch off lights and fans when not required.

Separate dry and wet dustbins:

Initiative to use "Use Me" dry and wet dustbins on the campus so as to keep the college campus clean. There is separate management for dry and wet waste, as color coded dustbins are used for different wastes. Green for wet waste and blue for solid waste.

Plastic free campus:

Colleges should avoid using plastic bags and bottles.

PRACTICES:

- The college has developed a beautiful campus with lots of plants.
- Signboards and posters are displayed on the college campus to encourage ideas of a plastic-free campus, noise pollution, and environmental awareness.
- The college organizes various competitions and programs based on environmental issues.
- LED bulbs are installed in the college to save electricity.
- Implemented 'Rain Water Harvesting in college premises.
- Implemented Friday as "No Fuel Day" in college.
- Extension activities by college students and staff to make people aware of outside college.
- Provided dustbins in various places to collect plastic waste.
- Conduct a green, environmental and energy audit.
